


At the Westbank Legion, November began with several members signing up to do Poppy tagging ahead of the annual Remembrance Day Ceremony in West Kelowna. The Branch's Colour Party also made an appearance at the Westwood Retirement Home Remembrance Day Ceremony, and again at the city parade a few days later.

That month, the Branch also hosted their 3rd Annual Long-Term Care Home Veterans' Christmas Dinner. Each year, Veterans and spouses of deceased Veterans are invited to this special holiday event. 



In November, the Alberni Valley Legion awarded a 50 Year Medal to Legion Member Harold Malcolm Kraus. The medal was presented by Roy Buchanan, Branch President, and Willem Groeneveld, Sergeant at Arms.


That month, members of the Branch also paid a special visit to the gravesite of a First World War Veteran. Roy Buchanan and Tim Murphy, Sergeant at Arms, saluted the gravesite of a fallen soldier recently discovered at the Catholic Cemetery on Falls Street. A wreath was laid on the headstone, dedicated to Pte. William F. Clark, 7th Battalion, C.E.F. Clark was born in 1897 and enlisted in Port Alberni in 1915. He was killed in action in May of 1916. Legion members learned that Clark's body was never repatriated, and the gravestone was raised in Clark's memory by his family.


